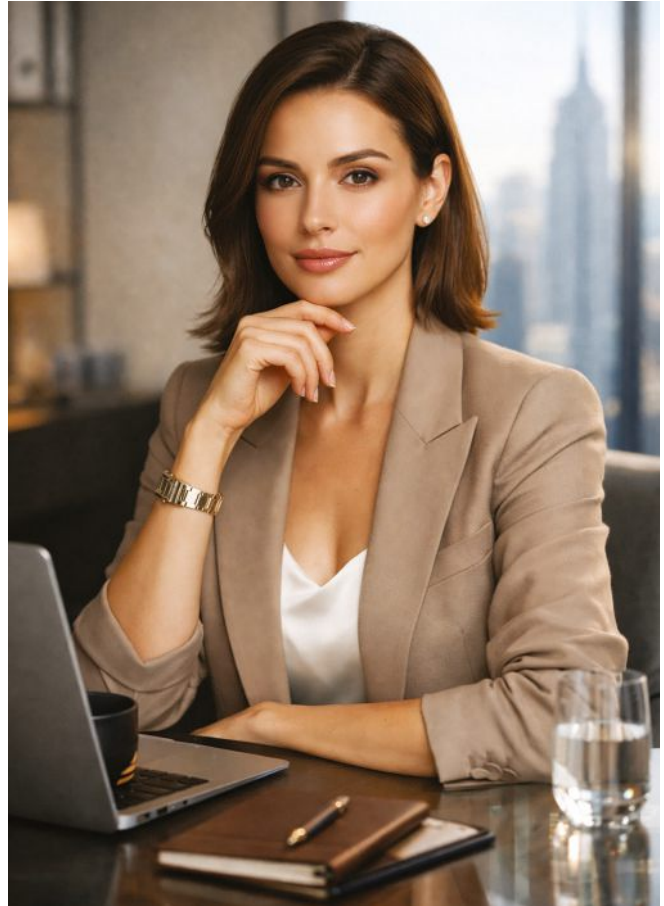

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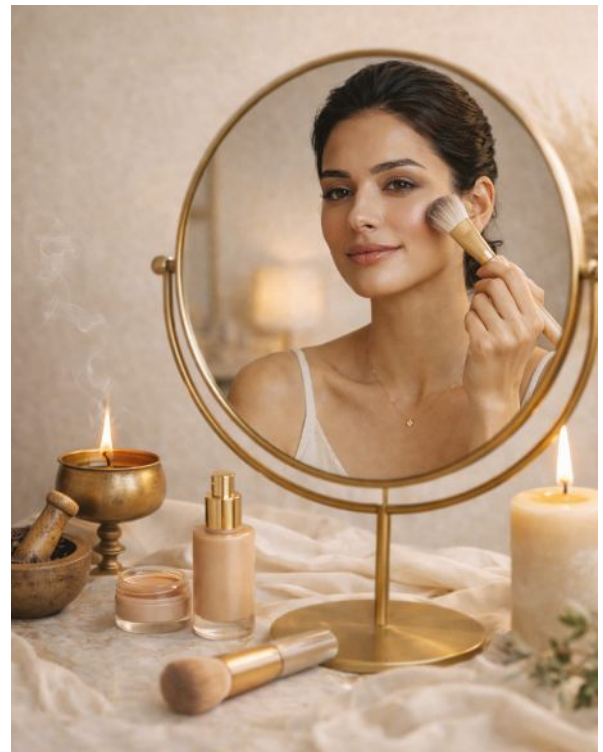

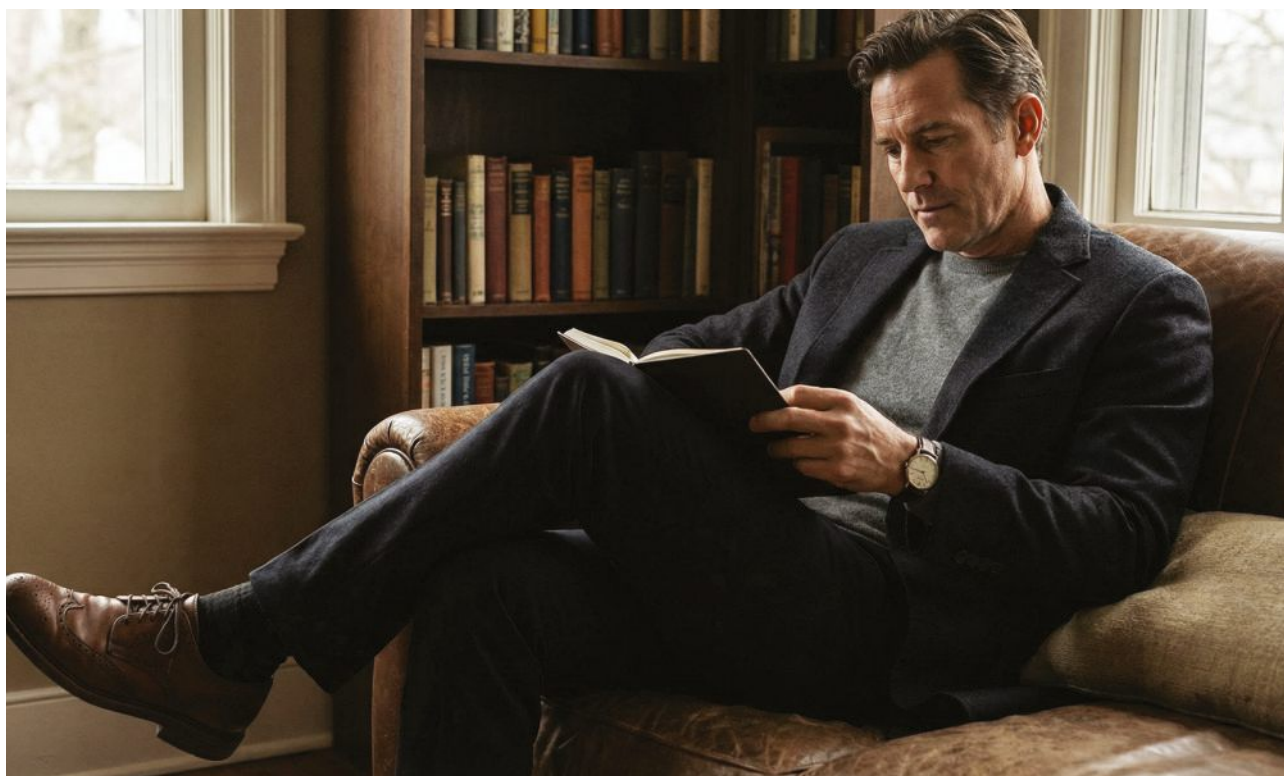

The Prince of Changing Seasons Padmara jan

*“Let us go to the villages and stay the night.
Let us wake up at dawn and see whether the
grapevines have sprouted and blossomed,
whether the pomegranate trees have flowered.
There, I shall offer you my love.”*

Few have descended into the subtle depths of the human mind and brought before us what seems unbelievable, while giving each character in a story its own distinct importance, as Padmarajan did. He was undoubtedly one of the most powerful storytellers Malayalam literature has ever known. Even today, his films remain etched in the hearts of

audiences. The characters that filled his cinema were often drawn from his village and from the lives he had encountered. When he brought to life a Gandharvan cursed and sent from the celestial world we had only heard about in grandmother's tales we too began to believe in that reality. In many ways, Padmarajan himself was a Gandharvan. Though he

lived only until the age of forty six, he carved unforgettable seasons of creative brilliance in Malayalam cinema and literature.

Padmarajan journeyed through uniquely creative paths. He was an artist who portrayed love and human emotions on screen with extraordinary beauty. His full name was



P.Padmarajan Pillai. He was born on May 23, 1946, in Muthukulam, Alappuzha district, as the sixth son of Ananthapadmanabha Pillai and Devakiyamma of Njavarakkal. His wife was Radhalakshmi, and his children are Ananthapadmanabhan and Madhavikutty.

After completing his primary education in Muthukulam, he earned a degree in Chemistry from Mahatma Gandhi University College, Thiruvananthapuram, in 1963. During this period, he also studied Sanskrit under Cheppad Achuthavaryar. While in college, his attention turned toward writing stories. His first published work was “Lola Miss Ford,” about an American girl, which appeared in Kaumudi Weekly. In 1965, he joined All India Radio, Thrissur, as an announcer and continued there until 1986. With his growing involvement in cinema, he voluntarily resigned from his position and later settled in Poojappura, Thiruvananthapuram.

He was renowned as a director, screenwriter, and novelist. Some of his most

memorable films include Oridathoru Phayalvaan (1981), Arappatta Kettiya Gramathil (1986), Namukku Parkkan Munthirithoppukal (1986), Thoovanathumbikal (1987), and Moonnam Pakkam (1988). His final film was Njan Gandharvan (1991).

Among his notable novels are Prathimayum Rajakumariyum, Rathinirvedam,

Manjukalam Notta Kuthira, Rithubhedangalude Parithoshikam, UdaKapola, and Nakshathrangale Kaaval works that deeply explored the realities of life.

He presented new dimensions of love and life through films like Thoovanathumbikal, portrayed same-sex affection without vulgarity in Deshadanakkili Karayarilla, and depicted



the romantic intensity of vineyards in Namukku Parkkan Munthirithoppukal. There are countless such screenplays that bear his unique signature.

His novel Nakshathrangale Kaaval (1971) gained widespread acclaim and won the Kerala Sahitya Akademi Award and the Kungumam Award that



year. Later works include Vadakkoru Hridayam, Itha Ivide Vare, and Shavavahanangalum Thedi. Novels such as Udakapola, Manjukalam Notta Kuthira, and Prathimayum Rajakumariyum were written after he became prominent in cinema. Other celebrated works include Peruvazhiyambalam and Rathinirvedam.

His first screenplay, Prayanam (1975), was



directed by Bharathan and marked the beginning of the acclaimed Bharathan Padmarajan partnership, which became central to what was known as “middle cinema” in Malayalam positioned between parallel and commercial cinema. Together, they portrayed sexuality with sensitivity and dignity, never descending into vulgarity.

Padmarajan wrote screenplays for 36 films and directed 18. Through the cinematic adaptation of Peruvazhiyambalam, he made his directorial debut. He received numerous national and international

honors, including the Kerala Sahitya Akademi Award and prestigious film awards. In addition to 15 novels and 35 screenplays, he wrote many short stories.

On January 24, 1991, while in Kozhikode to attend the preview of Njan Gandharvan, Padmarajan was found dead in his hotel room.

Thirty-five years have passed since the Gandharvan of stories fluttered away like a butterfly.

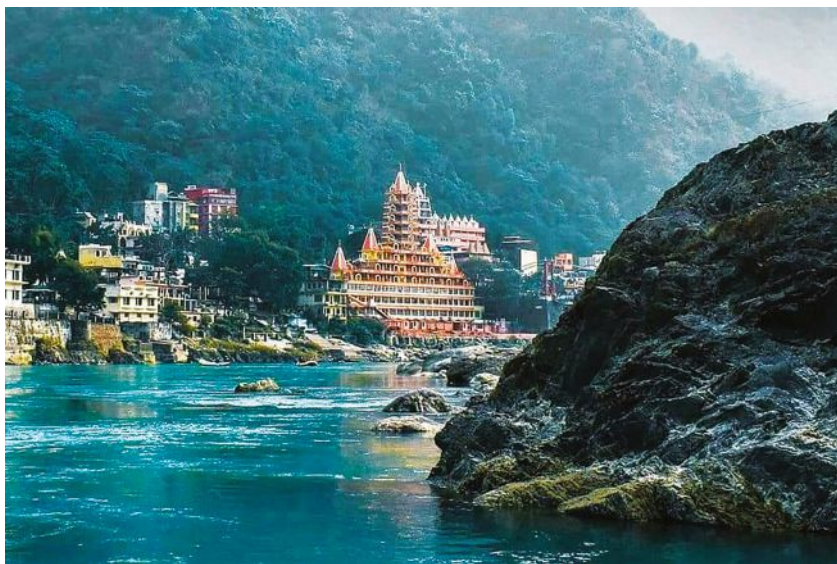

Chilanka

The Heartbeat of Dance

When movement becomes the life of dance, rhythm finds its companion in the Chilanka.

“Chilanka breathes life into dance. Without its sound, dance feels incomplete. By giving life to dance, the chilanka fulfills its purpose.”

In Indian classical dance traditions, the chilanka (also known as ghungroo) is considered the soul of performance and one of the most important ornaments. In Kerala's artistic and cultural heritage, it holds a unique and respected place. The melodious sound of these tiny bells, worn around the ankles, transforms dance from a purely visual experience into an auditory delight as well.

In traditional Indian dance forms especially Bharatanatyam, Kathak, Kuchipudi, Mohiniyattam, and Odissi the chilanka is an essential element.

Historical Significance

The history of the chilanka dates back thousands of years. References to sound instruments used in dance

can be found in the ancient Indian treatise Natyashastra. Chilanka gained prominence as part of temple dances and royal court performances.

In the Devadasi tradition and Gurukul training systems, the ceremony of tying the chilanka for the first time carried deep

spiritual and cultural meaning. It symbolized a dancer's formal initiation into the path of dance. Over time, it evolved as a significant part of India's cultural heritage.

Ancient sculptures and temple carvings depict dancers wearing chilanka, proving its long standing





association with artistic and cultural development. There is also a tradition of associating chilanka with divinity. In many temple dance rituals, prayers are offered before tying the chilanka, elevating dance from a mere art form to a spiritual experience.

Importance of Chilanka in Dance

• Enhances rhythmic

awareness

- Helps dancers synchronize their steps precisely with rhythm
- Creates a fusion of sound and visual experience for the audience
- Boosts confidence, motivating dancers through the sound of the bells
- Acts as a training tool to identify mistakes in footwork
- Serves as a cultural symbol

of Indian classical dance heritage

Materials Used to Make Chilanka

Bells: Copper, bronze, silver, or alloy metals

Strap / Thread: Cotton thread, leather strap, or velvet fabric

Cord / Base: Strong nylon or traditional thread

The quality of these materials determines the

clarity and durability of the sound.

The number of bells varies depending on the dance style and the dancer's experience level:

- Beginners: 50 to 100 bells
- Intermediate dancers: 100 to 150 bells
- Professional dancers: 150 to 250 or more bells

As the number of bells increases, the intensity and clarity of sound also increase. The precision of the dancer's footwork and rhythmic control become more evident. If a step goes wrong or rhythm falters, the chilanka clearly reveals it.



The bells are typically silver or copper in color, while the threads and fabrics used for tying come in different shades:

- Red Symbol of energy and enthusiasm
- Black Stability and

seriousness

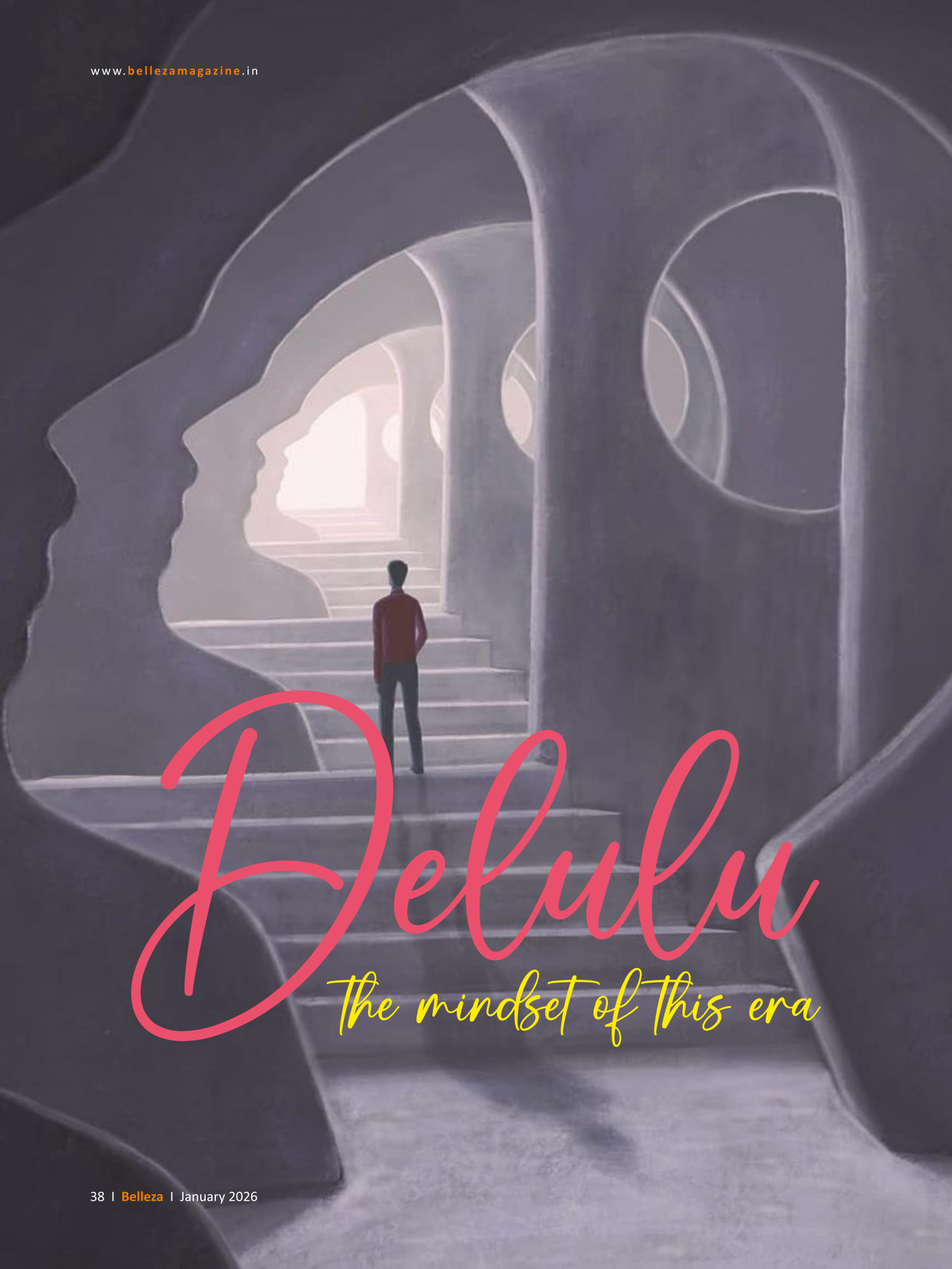
- White Purity and peace
- Gold Grandeur and divinity

Colors are often chosen to complement the dancer's costume.

Types of Chilanka

1. Bharatanatyam Chilanka – Thick bells with a strong, powerful sound
 2. Kathak Chilanka – More bells with a softer tonal quality
 3. Mohiniyattam Chilanka – Simple design with a gentle sound
 4. Kuchipudi Chilanka – Medium-intensity sound
 5. Odissi Chilanka – Designed to create melodic harmony in sound
- Each dance style has its own rhythm and movement vocabulary, which results in variations in the design and sound of the chilanka.

A movie costume, a character's lifestyle, a location all present a world more polished than reality. The moment we begin to desire it as truth, delulu begins.

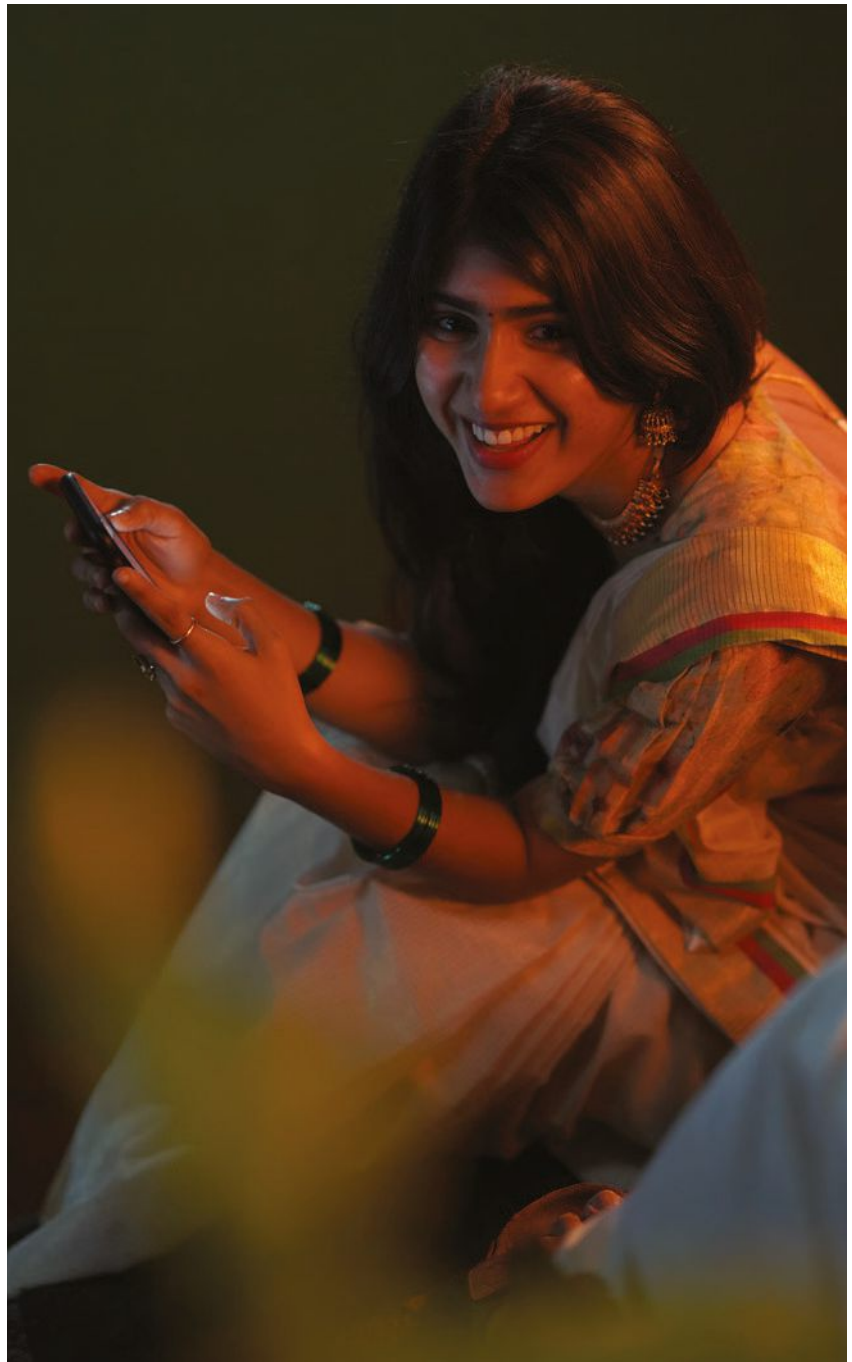

Delulu is not always dangerous. Art and fashion exist because of

imagination. The dress a designer first visualizes, the frame a director envisions everything begins in delulu. No creation has ever been born without a dream. 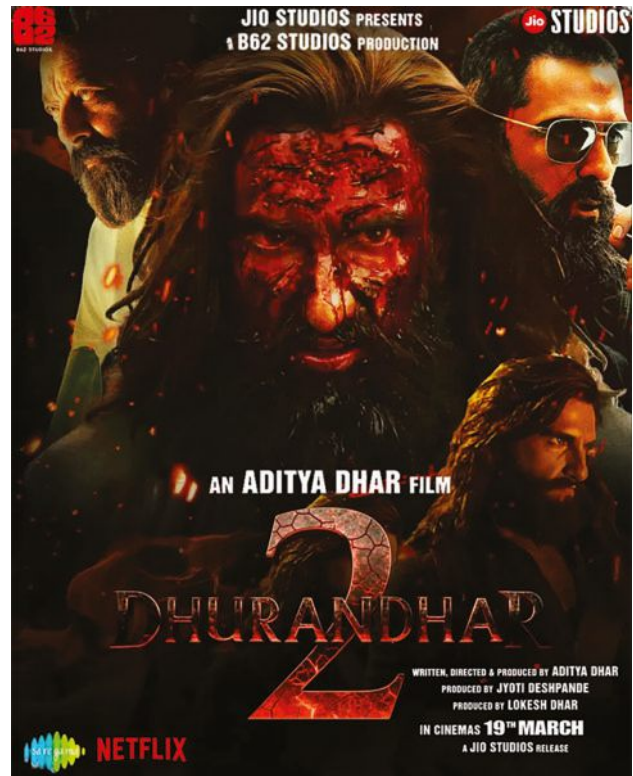
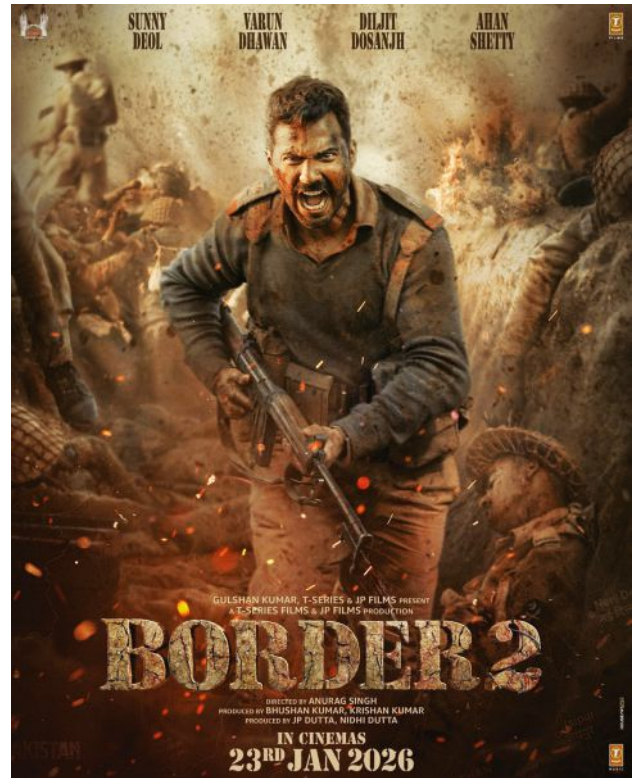

major releases of 2026.

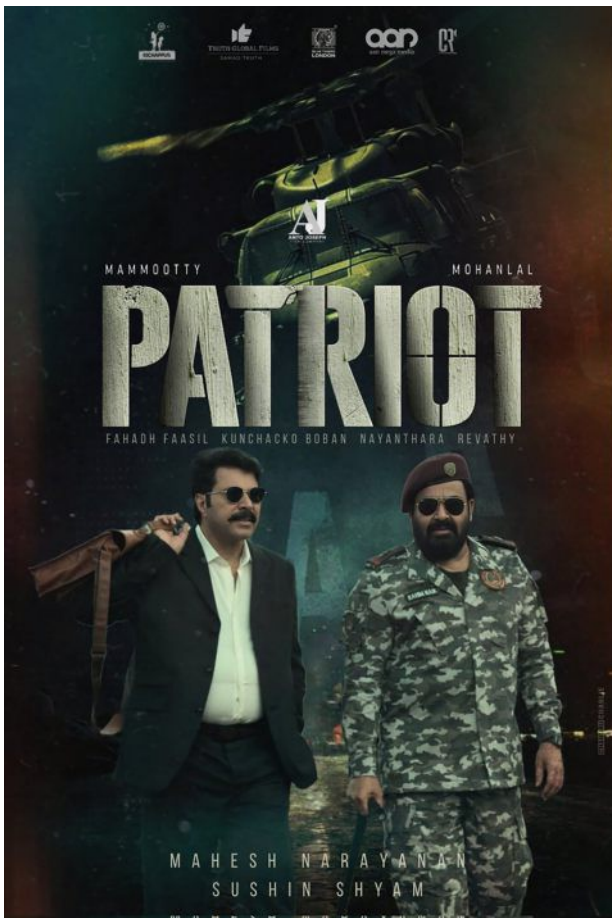

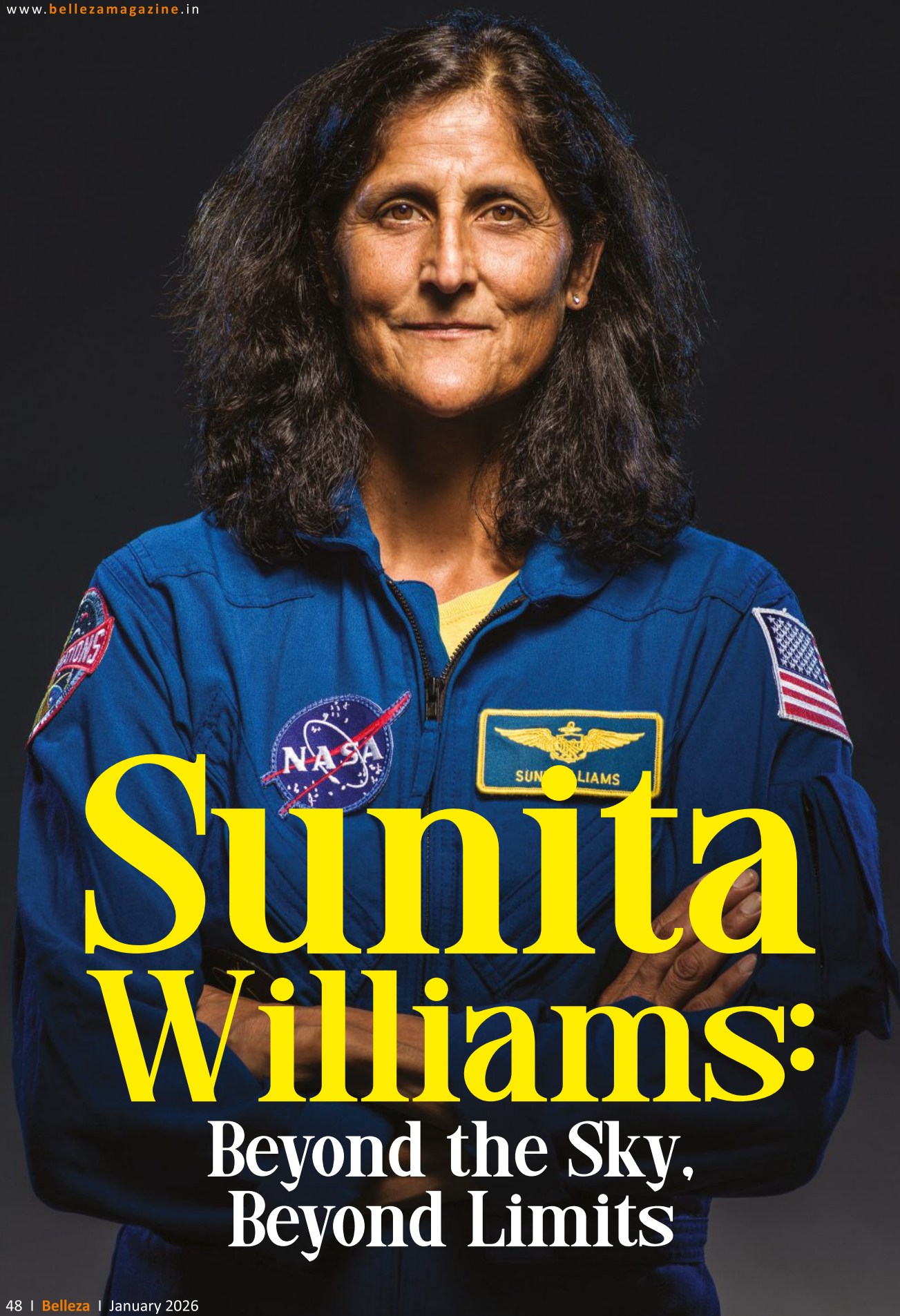

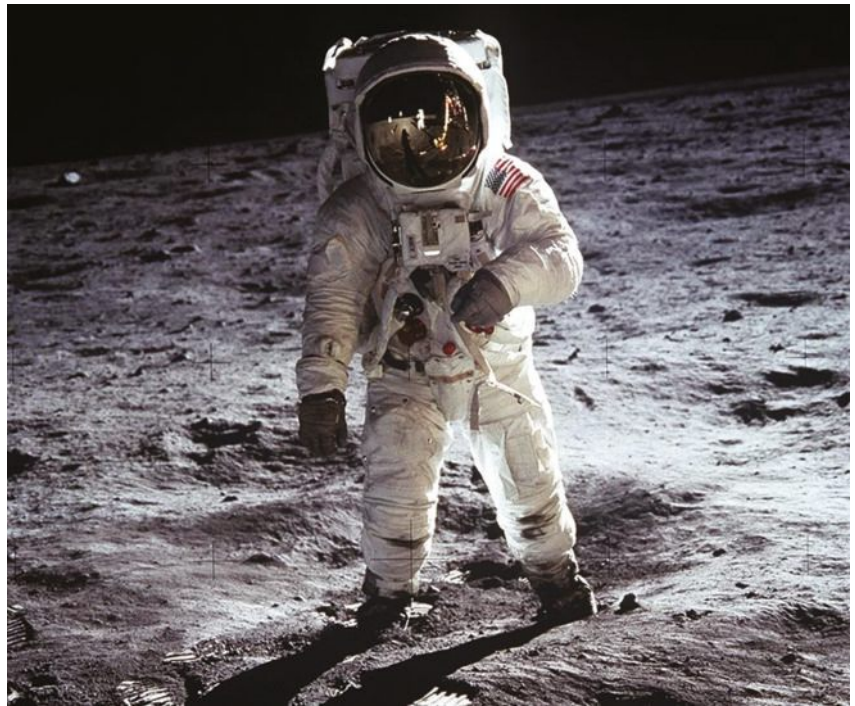
